Chapter 12 Teaching Outline: Adoption Changes Everything

INTRODUCTION: Turn the Page

Many people allow one chapter of their lives to define their entire story. They become trapped by failures, disappointments, wounds, rejection, or regret. Yet God is a God of new beginnings. He does not define us by our worst chapter but by His redeeming purpose.

There is an old saying:

“Never judge a book by one chapter. Sometimes you need to turn the page and move on.”

Your past may explain where you have been, but it does not determine where God is taking you. Through Jesus Christ, God has given believers a new identity through adoption. Adoption is not merely a doctrine, it is a transformation of identity, authority, and destiny.

As sons and daughters of God, we are no longer victims of hell's attacks. We are heirs of God's promises and members of His family.

1. ADOPTION CHANGES EVERYTHING

Galatians 4:4-7

“But when the fullness of the time had come, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, that we might receive the adoption as sons.

And because you are sons, God has sent forth the Spirit of His Son into your hearts, crying out, ‘Abba, Father!’

Therefore you are no longer a slave but a son, and if a son, then an heir of God through Christ.”

Paul teaches that salvation is more than forgiveness. It is adoption into the family of God.

The Transforming Power of Adoption

The word adopt can be viewed through two simple concepts:

- Ad – to add
- Opt – to choose

Adoption means to choose to add someone to your family.

This makes what God did for us absolutely amazing.

We were an option, and God chose us anyway.

John 15:16

“You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit, and that your fruit should remain, that whatever you ask the Father in My name He may give you.”

Regardless of your past, failures, family history, or present circumstances, the Father chose you.

You are wanted.

You are chosen.

You belong.

2. ADOPTION CANCELS YOUR PAST AND GIVES YOU A NEW FUTURE

When God adopts us, He does not simply improve our old life. He gives us a completely new identity.

1 Corinthians 6:20

“For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God’s.”

Our old life was purchased and redeemed by Jesus Christ.

Because of adoption:

- Your failures no longer define you.
- Your wounds no longer own you.
- Your past no longer controls your future.

God’s grace provides a new beginning.

2 Corinthians 5:17

“Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new.”

The old chapter is over.

A new story has begun.

3. ADOPTION IS COSTLY

Every adoption comes with a cost.

Our adoption cost heaven everything.

Jesus paid the ultimate price so that we could become sons and daughters of God.

- He left heaven.
- He endured rejection.
- He carried the cross.
- He shed His blood.

1 Peter 1:18-19

“Knowing that you were not redeemed with corruptible things, like silver or gold, from your aimless conduct received by tradition from your fathers,

but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot.”

Our adoption papers were signed with the blood of Jesus.

Never underestimate your value. Heaven paid the highest price imaginable to bring you into God’s family.

4. ADOPTION COMES WITH A PERMENANT COVENANT

A legal contract is a binding agreement that establishes rights, responsibilities, ownership, and inheritance. Once properly executed, it carries legal authority.

Our adoption into God’s family is not based on emotions, feelings, or circumstances. It is established through covenant.

Jesus ratified that covenant with His blood.

Hebrews 9:22

“And according to the law almost all things are purified with blood, and without shedding of blood there is no remission.”

Luke 22:20

“Likewise He also took the cup after supper, saying, ‘This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is shed for you.’”

The New Covenant is heaven’s legal declaration concerning every believer.

The covenant itself was established through the shed blood of Jesus Christ.

The Bible is not the covenant itself; rather, it is the written and authoritative record of that covenant and the promises that belong to God’s children.

Just as a legal contract is documented in writing, God has given us His Word as the permanent record of what Christ purchased through His blood.

The blood established the covenant.

The Word reveals the covenant.

The blood ratified the covenant.

The Word records the covenant.

The blood secured our inheritance.

The Word declares our inheritance.

Hebrews 10:23

“Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful.”

When the enemy attacks, we do not stand on our feelings.

We stand on what God has written.

When circumstances change, God’s covenant remains.

When culture changes, God’s covenant remains.

When hell opposes us, God’s covenant remains.

Hell cannot rewrite it.

Hell cannot cancel it.

Hell cannot amend it.

Hell cannot overturn it.

Isaiah 54:17

“No weapon formed against you shall prosper, and every tongue which rises against you in judgment you shall condemn. This is the heritage of the servants of the Lord, and their righteousness is from Me,” says the Lord.”

Matthew 24:35

“Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will by no means pass away.”

God’s covenant is permanent.

The blood signed it.

The Word confirms it.

The enemy cannot change it.

As adopted sons and daughters, we stand on a covenant that is legal, binding, eternal, and secure.

5. ADOPTION CHANGES YOUR NAME

When someone is adopted, they receive a new family identity.

Scripture teaches that believers receive a new identity in Christ.

You are no longer:

- Forsaken
- Rejected
- Abandoned
- Forgotten

You are now:

- Chosen
- Accepted
- Redeemed
- Loved
- A child of God

Revelation 2:17

“To him who overcomes I will give some of the hidden manna to eat. And I will give him a white stone, and on the stone a new name written which no one knows except him

who receives it.”

Hell may call you by your past, but God calls you by your new name.

6. ADOPTION CHANGES YOUR ADDRESS

Adoption relocates you.

Spiritually, God has transferred us from one kingdom to another.

You no longer belong to the kingdom of darkness.

You now belong to the Kingdom of God.

Colossians 1:13

“He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love.”

Your citizenship has changed.

Your authority has changed.

Your future has changed.

You are living from a new spiritual address.

7. ADOPTION THROUGHOUT SCRIPTURE

God has always demonstrated His heart through adoption and caring for others.

Pharaoh’s Daughter Adopted Moses

A Hebrew child marked for death became a deliverer because someone chose to receive him into her family.

Mordecai Adopted Esther

An orphan girl became a queen and saved a nation because someone took her in and raised her as his own daughter.

Job Cared for Orphans

Job 31:18

“But from my youth I reared him as a father, and from my mother’s womb I guided the widow.”

Job displayed the heart of God by caring for the fatherless.

Joseph Adopted Jesus

Though not Jesus’ biological father, Joseph embraced the responsibility of raising and protecting the Son of God.

God Through Jesus Adopted You

The greatest adoption story in history is your story.

The Father brought you into His family through Jesus Christ.

You are no longer an outsider.

You are family.

CONCLUSION:

Rise Up, Spell Breaker

Adoption tells us who we really are.

We are not slaves—we are sons and daughters.

We are not abandoned—we are accepted.

We are not powerless—we are heirs of God.

Romans 8:15-17

“For you did not receive the spirit of bondage again to fear, but you received the Spirit of adoption by whom we cry out, ‘Abba, Father.’

The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God,

and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ.”

Because we belong to God’s family, we have authority to stand against the works of darkness and break the lies, curses, and strongholds that the enemy attempts to establish over our lives and families.

The devil wants you to forget your identity.

God wants you to remember your adoption.

Know who you are.

Know whose you are.

Rise up as a son.

Rise up as a daughter.
